Your every move is being tracked. Someone knows what Web sites you're going to, exactly what pages you're looking at, and how long you stay on that Web site. Sounds like something out of a spy novel, but the fact is millions of computer users around the world are being spied on in cyberspace by spyware.

Essentially, spyware is software that is installed onto your computer without either your consent or your knowledge. Spyware is specifically designed to track your movement – both online and offline. The information gathered by the software is then transmitted to the person or entity that had the spyware installed on your computer.

Fortunately, you have a strong line of defense in detecting and wiping out the spyware on your computer: spyware remover software. Spyware remover software basically scans your computer to detect then wipe out any spyware. But, a good spyware remover does more than identify spyware on your system: It should also detect and remove adware, Trojans, worms, and other dangerous software that is downloaded onto your computer without your knowledge.

Effective spyware removers also back up your system, which is extremely important if you accidentally delete something that should not have been deleted. The backup allows you to recover the lost information.

A spyware remover is often very easy to use. Generally, you simply have to tell the software to scan your computer for problems, and the spyware remover will compile a list of all the problems it finds. It will then ask you to highlight all of those problems you want fixed, and it fixes the highlighted problems.

It's just that easy *if* you pick the right spyware remover software. Choose software that is user friendly, with instructions explaining the software and how it works in layman's terms. In addition, you should choose a company that offers customer and technical support, should you have any problems or questions.

The problem really is ensuring that you find, purchase, and use spyware remover software on a regular basis. Finding a good spyware remover program requires research on your part. Don't just choose the first spyware remover that you find. Rather, read as much about each spyware remover program as you can: Product descriptions from the manufacturer; reviews from those who have used the product; and reviews from online and offline software and computer publications.

Finally, if the spyware remover has a free trial scan, take advantage of it to test the speed and ease of the software. In turn, you will have a better idea of whether it's a product you want to purchase.
